

Foreword

CIF developed CSO directory and engagement plan and continues to work to strengthen capacity of local CSOs.

This CSO directory contains information about NGOs/CSOs in Georgia involved in the TB field. The Directory provides organizations' contact details and indicates the specific service areas/program components in which each organization has been engaged.

This directory is an initial step to build civil society network in the TB field in Georgia, and serves as an instrument for strengthening the referrals and institutional linkages within the network organizations.
